An Executive Council meeting was convened in the conference hall of Sequel Guest House Khammam (A.P.) at 1900 hours on 23rd Jan. 2010. The IBBF (Registered Society) passed and adopted the following resolutions:

In lieu of the vision of the world body, the Executive Council of the IBBF (Registered Society) as unanimously resolved to adopt the name and style, logo, constitution & rules, dress code, ethics, mission statement, quality statement and doping policy etc... to be implemented in consonance with the guidelines of the World Bodybuilding & Physique Sports Federation (WBPF) and Asian Bodybuilding and Fitness Federation (ABBF).
Note: The ABBF is recognized and affiliated to the Olympic Council of Asia (OCA).

Consequently, now the IBBF as a mandatory measure towards the acclamation of the above be named and called as the “INDIAN BODYBUILDING & PHYSIQUE SPORTS

FEDERATION” (IBPF) in order to carry on the 50 years legacy of IBPF in over all control of body building sport in India.

It was also unanimously resolved that, for effective follow-up, service and liasoning with all government offices, sport control and sports promotion boards, Indian Olympic Association (IOA) and the Ministry of Sports Government of India, Mr. Amit Swami, Executive Director shall henceforth represent the Indian Bodybuilding & Physique Sports Federation (IBPF).

The house showered all pages and accolades on Mr. Swami Ramesh Kumar for the exceptional arrangements made by him during hosting of the 48th Junior National Bodybuilding Championship at Khammam (A.P).

The executive council members also praised the dedicated efforts of Mr. Bharath Chandra the young sports lover and promoter for his contribution towards the promotion of body building sports in Southern India.

The ensuing Junior National Championship was well represented with a participation of over 129 Body builders below the age of 21 years and masters over the age of 40 from 20 states across India.

The Championship was well attended by former Bodybuilding stars of India like Arjuna Awardee Mr. T.V Poly Asian Gold Medalist, Mr. Anadan and several stalwarts along with galaxy of sports loving industrialist, socialites and people from all walks of life to boost the model of the young and upcoming body builders.
